SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Department of Public Works is preparing an application for submittal to the Alaska Sustainable Salmon Fund by the deadline of July 2, 2025.

This project would continue a partnership between the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) to address fish passage barriers identified and prioritized by ADF&G, based on the extent of upstream habitat and the severity of barriers to fish passage. This application will request \$900,000 for fish passage

improvements to the culverts on $49^{\rm th}$ State Street and Tern Drive at Wasilla Creek Tributary Fish Passage.
