- (D)(2), by inserting the words "and shall renew such registration every three years" after the word "operating" and by inserting the words "or renewal" after the word "registration" to read: "small-scale race tracks shall register with the Borough prior to operating and shall renew such registration every three years. Upon registration or renewal the following shall be submitted to the Borough';
- by inserting a new (3) to read as follows: "If the owner, operator, agent, or land upon which a small-scale operation exists is convicted of more than three citations involving a violation of MSB 17.63, the small-scale designation is revoked and a conditional permit under this chapter is required"; and
- MSB 17.63.010(E), by inserting the words "or lose their small-scale designation" after the word "year" to read: "Commercial race tracks which host more than 10 events per year, or lose their small-scale designation, are considered large-scale and require a conditional use permit in accordance with this chapter."

Assemblymember Sykes moved to postpone the primary amendment to November 20, 2018. The motion passed by the following vote:
