SUMMARY STATEMENT: In 2020, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough accepted and appropriated a grant from the United States Fish and Wildlife Services (USFWS) in the amount of \$189,076 to design and construct 28 identified fish barrier and fish-friendly culverts. This grant had a match requirement of \$189,076.

The grant is set to increase annually for five years, ending in 2025. The USFWS has issued a revision awarding an additional \$240,000 for this year. The award requires the Borough to provide

\$240,000 in matching funds. Matching funds are available from areawide capital appropriations that were set aside to match fish passage grants, project Nos. 30114-1811 and 30114-1812.

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough is a member of the Mat-Su Basin Salmon Conservation Partnership, which is one of four nationally recognized fish partnerships by the National Fish Habitat Action Plan Board, through the USFWS. The partnership has created a strategic plan, which lists obstructions to fish passage as one of the major threats to salmon health in the Mat-Su Basin, and the projects identified in this legislation are but a few of these projects. Through this partnership, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service works collaboratively to remove barriers to fish passages, thus keeping our salmon population healthy and viable.

RECOMMENDATION OF ADMINISTRATION: Accept, appropriate additional funds, and approve the scope of work and amended budget for the Mat-Su Borough Fish Passage 2025 project.
