Agricultural and Forestry Board

IM 214, and its accompanying resolution, extends various Borough Boards and Commissions. One of these is the Agricultural and Forestry Advisory Board (MSB 4.44). This board was originally created in 1985 and altered slightly as to functions in 1994 and 1999. Unlike the Parks, Recreation and Trails Advisory Board (a similar advisory board that works with the Community Development Department), the Agricultural and Forestry Board exists in name only and is dysfunctional.

At a work session this spring on forestry issues, I recommended that the Assembly let this advisory board sunset, and create a new board, "Asset Management Advisory Board" as described below. I believe this was recommendation was generally agreed to by the Assembly.

In the last four years the Agricultural and Forestry Advisory Board has only met one time where it had a quorum. The reasons for this are many including, lack of sufficient members, narrow focus and membership comprised of specific organizations, some of which are inactive.

As presently constituted this board is composed of 9 members with designated seats:

Upper Susitna Soil Conservation District
Wasilla Soil Conservation District
Palmer Soil Conservation District
Matanuska-Susitna Loggers' Association
A person with experience in Alaska agricultural or forestry management services
A person with experience in legislative affairs involving agriculture or forestry
A person with experience in agricultural or forest economics

A person who is interested in the borough's agricultural and forest development A representative from an agricultural organization

The current functions of the Board are as follows:

- 1. Advise the assembly on all matters affecting agriculture and forestry in the borough;
- 2. Advise the assembly and the planning commission on all elements of the borough comprehensive plan and any amendments affecting agriculture and forestry in the borough;
- Assist in the identification of all agricultural lands which may be preserved in an existing agricultural use or brought into agricultural use;
- 4. Assist in establishing policies for the use of forest lands and in the identification of forest lands which may be either maintained as sustained yield forest lands or wood lots, or cleared for agricultural use after salvaging the timber;
- 5. Where agricultural and forest lands are located among lands with a high recreation, tourism, homesites or other potential, recommend to the assembly and the planning commission on specific means for balancing the uses to meet all borough development goals, particularly with respect to offering home and recreation sites for sale to meet state goals for transfer of state and borough lands to private ownership;
- 6. Develop proposals for roads, bridges and other capital improvements that are needed to fully realize the potential of borough agricultural and forest lands with recommendations as to funding and priorities;
- 7. Assist in the development of land management, land sale and land lease policies that shall better achieve berough goals for agricultural and forest lands by reviewing proposed classifications of parcels approximately 40 acres and greater in size and the proposed reclassification of all parcels classified agriculture or forest management and may review parcels of less than 40 acres for Class II or better soils or in the environs of the existing agriculture parcels; and
- 3. Develop procedures for obtaining a consensus within the agricultural community so that local agriculture and forestry can be effectively represented in their dealing with the local, state and federal governments.

I recommend that the existing board be re-constituted to not only reflect the boroughs agricultural and timber interests and needs, but to better reflect the multiple goals and missions of the borough dealing with the use, conservation and management of the boroughs land and resource assets and the functions of the Land and Resource Division (land sales, leases, permits reservations and acquisitions; timber sales and other forestry uses (conks, birch syrup, bowls, dimension lumber); agriculture and grazing; wetlands banking and watershed management; material (sand and gravel) and land classifications.

The composition of this new "Asset Management Advisory Board" would reflect the above with members representing:

A Soil Conservation District
Agriculture/Grazing
Timber
Forest Products (mill, birch syrup)
Recreation (parks, recreation and trails)
Tourism (visitor services, hunting, fishing, eco-tourism)
Institution (Native Corporation, University of Alaska or Mental Health Land Trust)

Real Estate (development, sales, marketing) Material (sand and gravel) Use and Development Members at Large (general public)

I further recommend that the Functions of this new board be changed to:

- Advise the Assembly on all matters affecting real estate and natural resource development;
- Advise the Assembly and Planning Commission on all elements of the borough comprehensive land plan and any amendments affecting land and natural resource development and use;
- 3. Review and amendments to the Borough's Reai Preperty Inventory (MSB 23.05.050);
- 4. Assist in the identification of land that should be used for land disposals, public facilities, agriculture, forestry (various types of sales and management regimes), materials (sand, gravel, peat), wetlands banking, watershed protection and management;
- Advise the Assembly on fees and market values for the use or disposal of land and natural resources;
- 6. Assist in the development of land and resource management to better achieve borough goals by reviewing and recommending land and natural resource management plans, land disposals, timber sustained yield and harvest goals and levels, large and small scale agricultural development, land and natural resource marketing, and proposed land classifications;
- Recommend to the Assembly methods and programs for balancing the uses of the borough's land and natural resource assets to meet all borough development, reservation and protection goals.
- 3. Develop proposals for roads, bridges and other infrastructure related to capital improvements that are needed to fully realize the potential of borough land and natural resources;
- Make recommendations to the Assembly on the borough's annual operating budget for land and natural resource management.

If this new board is created, I further recommend that the Park, Recreation and Trails Advisory Board and the new Asset Management Advisory Board meet jointly at least twice a year to discuss and make recommendations on topics of mutual interest.
