#### **I. CALL TO ORDER**

The regular meeting of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly was held on Wednesday, October 21, 2020, at the Borough Assembly Chambers, 350 E. Dahlia Avenue, Palmer, Alaska. The meeting was called to order at 9 a.m. by Mayor Vern Halter.

#### **II. ROLL CALL**

#### **III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

The agenda was approved as presented without objection.

#### **IV. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The pledge of allegiance was led by Mr. Eugene Carl Haberman, a member of the audience.

## VIII. INTRODUCTION (For Public Hearing 10/26/20, Assembly Chambers)

**OR 20-098** An Ordinance Waiving The Witness Signature Requirement For Absentee By Mail Ballots For The Regular Borough Election To Occur On November 3, 2020.

Ms. McKechnie read the legislation into the record.

Each candidate was asked and answered the following questions:

Describe the most challenging management situation you ever experienced and how did you strive to resolve the challenge? What was the outcome and, if you could revisit the situation, would you do anything differently?

If you have reviewed our budget and CAFR, what is your assessment of our financial condition and what recommendations do you have for us for improvement and to achieve long-term fiscal sustainability without raising taxes? Tell us about your fiscal management experience budgeting, reporting, cutting costs, building and maintaining reserves.

Follow Up: What is your philosophy when faced with a budget shortfall.

Describe your management style and in your daily activities, how do you ensure accountability and avoiding priorities of the Borough Assembly falling through cracks or otherwise being unachieved?

What is your experience with collective bargaining and maintaining productive relationships with organized labor?

Follow Up: Have you ever been before a labor arbitrator or court? What do you consider to be the Borough's top three opportunities and how would you capitalize on them? Conversely, what are the top three challenges and how would you advise the Assembly to approach them?

If the Mayor and Assembly adopted a policy or collectively expressed a stance with which you had significant professional disagreement, how would you express that disagreement and seek resolution? Can you cite an example in your response?

Discuss your approach to and experience with economic development and diversification of the tax base. Can you share both a success story and a project that did not turn out as well as you hoped and what you learned from it?

First, please tell us about your management style with department directors. Then, please describe how you view the interaction of department heads and other staff with the Assembly, versus the Manager's role.

Follow Up: With a highly experienced senior staff, how would you evaluate their abilities and establish your management approach?

Are there any questions that you we did not ask that you think we should have?

**VII. EXECUTIVE SESSION (For Subjects That Tend To Prejudice The Reputation Or Character Of Any Person, Provided That Person May Request A Public Discussion; Matters Which By Law Are Required To Be Confidential; And Matters Involving Consideration Of Government Records That By Law Are Not Subject To Public Disclosure.)**

## **A. Filling the Vacancy of the Borough Manager and Discussion of Qualifications**
