SUMMARY STATEMENT: The Port MacKenzie Rail Extension (PMRE) project was funded by direct grants from the Alaska Legislature from FY2008 through FY2015 totaling \$184 million. An additional \$200 million is needed to complete the project. As the Borough continues to explore options to advance a transportation corridor in this area, the Borough would like to pursue funding opportunities to utilize the rail corridor for alternate modes of transportation. The corridor could be used in other ways such as a pathway, recreational trail, seasonal road, industrial road, or a public road.

I am wondering if there is someone at DCCED that might suggest a grant amendment or something in writing that would clarify it is ok for multi-modal use. Thank you for taking the time to meet yesterday and discuss your project. I looked into your question and you are fine to move forward on your plans with only two small caveats that we could identify.

Absent a legislative change in scope any expenditures of the existing open grants should continue to be spent on rail extension activities. However it is permissible for the borough to make further use of the site and improvements for other modes of transport as long as any changes to improvements funded with grant 13-GO-010 (funded from bond proceeds) are still made available for use by the general public once completed.

My understanding is that the outstanding funds on the existing grants are pretty minimal, however, if you do think there is need for those funds to pivot to the new multi-modal plan let me know and we can look at a scope change for consideration during budget development.
