**MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH
RESOLUTION SERIAL NO. 22-083**

A RESOLUTION OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY AMENDING THE PROVISION OF A ONE-TIME WAIVER OF LANDFILL FEES FOR UP TO FOUR DUMPSTERS FOR THE BIG LAKE AREA AND REMOVAL OF UP TO THIRTY JUNK VEHICLES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023.

WHEREAS, Resolution Serial No. 22-063 appropriated \$31,000 from the community cleanup fund fiscal year 2023 for 4 dumpsters and 30 junk vehicles, which was adopted by the Assembly on June 7, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Resolution Serial No. No. 22-063 allowed for four dumpsters near West Sunrise Drive and South Medora Cross Street and the removal of 30 junked cars near West Peaceful Place; and

WHEREAS, the actual cost for the previously adopted resolution will be less than expected. Community members have suggested that the scope of work should increase because there are several junk cars and other large pieces of debris also in need of removal and will not fit in a dumpster; and

WHEREAS, the community is scheduled to start filling the four dumpsters on September 2, 2022, and would like to expand the scope of work in the same area and not exceed the original budget of \$31,000 from the previously approved fiscal year 2023 budget; and

WHEREAS, MSB 8.05.090(C) does not allow for free waste disposal, except by Assembly Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Assembly supports amending the scope of work for Resolution No. 22-063.

SCOPE OF WORK

A one-time waiver of landfill fees located near West Peaceful Place, West Sunrise Drive, and South Medora Cross Street, to remove junked vehicles without limitations regarding the number of dumpsters/cars or materials removed; however, not to exceed \$31,000.00 as previously adopted for all of this work. This money is from the community clean-up fund FY2023 budget.
