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XII. MAYOR, ASSEMBLY, AND STAFF COMMENTS

Mr. Moosey related that a Borough employee passed away on the way to work this morning, Mr. Pete Roney.

Assemblymember Sykes thanked the veteran's that provided testimony. Opined that there are many unanswered questions about the Veteran's Wall of Honor being moved. Summarized the history of how moving the wall came about. Stated that the Assembly supports veterans. Thanked the body for the meeting.

Assemblymember Mayfield agreed that the Assembly respects and supports veterans. Stated that the body tried to ensure that was conveyed when the discussion first came about. Stated that the city of Wasilla has worked with five separate veteran's organizations in the Borough to find a suitable place for it to be relocated to. Noted that there is no way to always get 100 percent agreement on anything. Opined that the new location for the wall is beautiful and that the phased development will only enhance the area and provide the perfect place to honor veterans. Thanked the public for their testimony.

Assemblymember Doty stated that she enjoyed the discussion surrounding the working group for shooting ranges. Encouraged the public to apply and provide input. Stated that she understood how so much confusion arose from the wall being moved. Provided a history of the transfer of the title to the property. Stated that she supports the Red Cross of Alaska.

Assemblymember Leonard thanked the public for their testimony. Stated that he would like to see the full history of how the wall move has evolved.

Assemblymember Beck provided a history of the property sale that impacted the veteran's wall. Noted that the new location will be ready for Veteran's Day celebrations this year. Noted that it is possible to develop a shooting range in a subdivision as he has seen it first hand in Montana. Spoke to the Parks Highway accident that claimed the lives of four Palmer residents.

Mayor Halter stated that it is difficult to hear the issues surrounding the veteran's wall being moved. Noted that his original intent was that it not be moved. Summarized the number of times the property has changed hands. Stated that he is hopeful that the new location will live up to veteran's standards. Expressed his appreciation for the service of veterans. Thanked the body for the meeting.
