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Assembly Presentation 2022

Hello, I'm Diane Holl-Rambo, chair of the Mat-Su Borough Library Board, and we would like to invite you to our libraries. (First slide).

As we slowly return to "normal" we would like to tell you how important our libraries are to our communities. When you visit each of our communities especially those outside the core area, folks will tell you the libraries are central to the community. They are a driver for the economic engines and attract business. Often our libraries are the gathering places in an emergency. Earlier this year when the borough was hit by high winds and prolonged electrical outages our libraries opened their doors for people to get warm and charge electrical devices.

In an article written by Kelly Jensen and published on BookRiot (<https://bookriot.com/libraries-are-more-popular-than-ever/>) she states libraries are not dying but they are changing. E-books and video, physical, and digital audio are roughly 60% of many library's collections. And this data was from before the pandemic. (2nd slide)

Further information from the same article states "Libraries are filling significant technology needs in their communities, including wifi.

Our Library staff are one of the most valuable components of our libraries (3rd slide) A review of the mission statements for our seven libraries reveals the importance of staff and libraries. This includes teaching people how to read, providing programming for the children and youth of our communities, providing social support contacts, and generally changing lives and building communities.

Our facilities are equally important. Some are very small and cramped while others are much newer and more spacious with room for community activities. (4th slide)

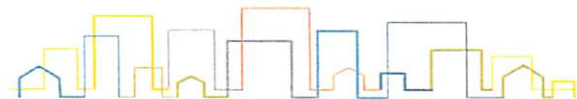
