Thank you for your letter to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) dated February 17, 2023, requesting a period of performance extension for the above-referenced Project Worksheet (PW).

The current period of performance end date for the disaster is January 31, 2024, and the current period of performance end date for the PW is February 1, 2023. This project has been extended 30 months beyond its initial PW period of performance. The initial period of performance is six months for emergency work and 18 months for permanent work.

The PW was prepared to reimburse for the costs associated with repairing extensive interior and exterior damages to the Matanuska-Susitna Borough's (Subrecipient) Houston Middle School.

On March 28, 2022, the president determined the damage in certain areas of the State of Alaska resulting from an earthquake on November 30, 2018, was of sufficient severity and magnitude that special cost sharing arrangements were warranted regarding federal funds provided under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq. (the "Stafford Act"), therefore amending the declaration of January 31, 2019, to authorize federal funds for all categories of Public Assistance at 90 percent of total eligible costs. As a result, Version 1 was created as a cost share amendment for this project and awarded on July 8, 2023.

The Subrecipient requested a time extension beyond the current PW period of performance due to various delays beyond its control. Their inability to meet the previously approved time extension deadline (January 31, 2023) is attributed to delays in getting a scope of work approval and obligation for Houston Middle School's (HMS) improved project. Additional delays include prolonged insurance settlement negotiations and logistics and supply chain issues.

Due to the extenuating circumstances discussed here and in your letter, FEMA is approving the extension of the performance period for PW 343 to October 31, 2023.
