SUMMARY STATEMENT: The Bogard Road Extension East (BREE) project created a parallel, separated pathway that provides a connection from the Glenn Highway in Palmer to Colony Middle School. The BREE pathway receives daily use from surrounding neighborhoods, two high schools, and a middle school. There is a significant amount of Equestrian Acres and Equestrian Glen community members who now walk along Folsom Drive to access the BREE pathway.

Folsom Drive currently has no shoulder or "safe" walking zone and only an unimproved dirt path extending through the ditch connecting to Bogard Road.

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough has submitted a grant application to

the Mat-Su Trails and Parks Foundation for funds to construct an 8'wide connecting pathway with curb to provide a safe area along Folsom Drive from Equestrian Street to the BREE pathway. A culvert and level fill will be installed in the BREE ditch for the 8'wide connecting pathway to traverse, again allowing for improved, safe access to the BREE pathway.

The Equestrian Homeowners Association met in August 2018 and voted to provide \$2,500 towards the construction of the connecting pathway.

**RECOMMENDATION OF ADMINISTRATION:** Accept and appropriate the Equestrian Homeowners Association's donation in the amount of \$2,500 to Fund 430, Project 35299 and approve the scope of work and budget for the Folsom Drive to Bogard Road Connecting Pathway project.

On behalf of the Equestrian Homeowners Association (EHOA) Board, and our two-hundred eighty association homeowners, we wish to again reiterate the need and value for constructing a connecting pathway from the separated Bogard Road Extension pathway to the Monti Vista and Equestrian Street roads intersection, now officially named the Bogard-Folsom Pathway.
