If you do not agree with the PW as written, or determinations regarding project eligibility, Scope of Work, time limits, funding, or other determinations, an appeal process is available. This process requires written correspondence identifying the action under appeal with an appropriate justification within 60 days of receipt of this Award. Please attach all pertinent documentation supporting your appeal and mail to:

Thank you for your letter to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) dated January 31, 2023, requesting a period of performance extension for the above-referenced Project Worksheet (PW).

The current period of performance end date for the disaster is January 31, 2024, and the current period of performance end date for the PW is October 31, 2022. This project has been extended 39 months beyond its initial PW period of performance. The initial period of performance is six months for emergency work and 18 months for permanent work. For temporary facilities, FEMA must approve any extensions to the project deadline per the Public Assistance Program and Policy Guide (PAPPG), Temporary Relocation of Essential Services (April (2018). FEMA considers the timeframe necessary to restore the damaged facility when evaluating time extensions for temporary facilities. To date, the Alaska Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (Recipient) has approved one time extension of an additional six months through January 31, 2021, and a second through October 31, 2022.

The PW was prepared to reimburse for the costs associated with emergency protective measures. The Matanuska-Susitna Borough (Subrecipient) utilized force account labor, materials, rented equipment and contracts to relocate the Houston Middle School (HMS) educational equipment and instructional materials into portable classrooms and provided student activities at alternate sites due to extensive damages.

The Subrecipient requested a time extension beyond the current PW period of performance due to various delays beyond its control. The Improved Project to replace the HMS (PW 343) was expected to take 12 to 18 months to complete. However, due to logistics and supply chain issues, the completion is now mid-March 2023. Demobilization of the temporary portable structures and closeout activities will follow completion of PW 343.

Due to the extenuating circumstances discussed here and in your letter, FEMA is approving the extension of the performance period for PW 153 to August 31, 2023.
