SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Alaska Long Trail is an initiative sponsored by a coalition of partners and led by Alaska Trails that seeks to establish a 500mile trail from Seward to Fairbanks.

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough Land and Resource Management Division's Policies and Procedures Manual Part 25, Public Easements and Rights-of-Way, Section 3.5, states "it is the policy of the Borough to provide for an integrated network of easements, rights-of-ways, and trails, etc." Furthermore, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough's location is a keystone position for connectivity along the proposed Alaska Long Trail, between Seward and Fairbanks.

The State of Alaska's proposed general obligation bond includes a

\$13.2M allocation for the Alaska Long Trail. Projects in the Bond Measure are "shovel ready", therefore once funding is available, these trail-building projects will provide employment opportunities for Alaskan residents. The construction of the Alaska Long Trail would also provide additional reasons for visitors to spend time and money in the Borough. This will help create more opportunities for local businesses.

The Alaska Long Trail project list identifies \$1.9M for trail construction connecting Government Peak Recreation Area with the Hatcher Pass area. This is consistent with the Borough's Hatcher Pass - Government Peak Unit Asset Management and Development Plan (2012), and the State's Hatcher Pass Management Plan (2010).

The Alaska Long Trail would have the additional benefit to expand recreation opportunities for residents, providing more chances for Alaskans to be active, healthy and happy.

If the general obligation bond does not move forward, the legislation includes language to support shifting the funding to the State's capital budget.

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough Parks, Recreation, and Trails Advisory Board (PRTAB) approved PRTAB Resolution 20-02, on October 26, 2020, in support of the Alaska Trails Initiative and Alaska Long Trail.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Parks, Recreation, and Trails Advisory Board supports the Alaska Trails Initiative, the Statewide Trails Investment Strategy and the Alaska Long Trail, provided that the cost of maintenance is considered for infrastructure investments, and recommends the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly adopt a resolution in support of these efforts.
