SUMMARY STATEMENT:

This ordinance will appropriate \$188,866.80 from a judgment in the Borough's favor to a project account for future junk and trash cleanup efforts.

In May of 2018 the Matanuska-Susitna Borough filed a lawsuit seeking an injunction against a property owner related to the junk and trash on his property. The Borough obtained a permanent

injunction (ordering the property owner to clean his property) and a judgment for penalties and attorney's fees in the amount of \$188,866.80 in June of 2019. The property owner did not follow the order of the court to clean the property, nor the July 2020 contempt order obtained by the Borough, nor did he pay the Borough's monetary judgment.

In May of 2022 the Borough began proceedings to collect its judgment by going through the court processes to sell properties owned by the property owner via a writ of execution sale. There were also other outstanding liens on the property. In June of this year (2023), the properties at issue were scheduled to be sold at the courthouse for the highest bid. Shortly before the sale, the property owner hired an attorney and began discussing with the Borough ways to satisfy the Borough's judgment and cleaning up the property. The Borough was unwilling to cancel the writ of execution sale, but ultimately delayed the sale on a week-to-week basis for a few weeks. During that time, the property owner exerted some effort to clean up the property and sold the properties to new owners with the condition that the new owners finish the clean-up process. The Borough's judgment against the prior owner who caused the longstanding junk and trash violations was paid from the proceeds of the private sale. The Borough then released its judgement lien against the properties, and terminated its writ of execution sale.

The ordinance here will appropriate the funds into a project account to be used for community clean up and abatement of junk and trash issues. There is already a program being developed for such as a result of an appropriation of \$100,000 from the FY 2024 operating budget. This \$188,866.80 is proposed to be placed in a project account so it does not lapse and will also be restricted to use related to cleanup efforts.
