**MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH
ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 22-039**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY APPROVING THE CONSOLIDATION OF MULTIPLE ANIMAL CARE AND REGULATION PROJECTS, AND THE REAPPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FOR THOSE PROJECTS INTO A SINGLE PROJECT; AND TO EXTEND THE PROJECT DEADLINE TO JUNE 30 2025.

WHEREAS, the Animal Care and Regulation Division (the Division) has multiple capital improvement projects with unused funds; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to expand outdoor shelter capacity in emergency situations and seizure cases in order to make more efficient use of the facility property; and

WHEREAS, the Division would like to consolidate the following project funds in order to make the necessary upgrades; and

WHEREAS, \$296,722.58 from project no. 10176, Fund 435; \$169,022.67 from project no. 10151, Fund 435; and \$60,000 from project no. 45168, fund 480, will be reappropriated into project no. 10189, fund 435, Animal Care Facility Improvements; and

WHEREAS, adoption of this ordinance will place these funds into one capital improvement project, project no. 10189, fund 435. These upgrades to the facility will directly improve the quality of care for the animals the shelter receives.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. Classification. This Ordinance is a noncode ordinance.


Section 2. Acceptance and Appropriation Source. The Assembly hereby approves the consolidation and reappropriation of \$296,722.58 from project no. 10176, fund 435; \$169,022.67 from project no. 10151, fund 435; and \$60,000 from project no. 45168, fund 480, into project no 10189, fund 435 for Animal Care Facility Improvements; and extending the project deadline to June 30, 2025.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.
