MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 23-037

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY NAMING STATION 6-1 THE BENNY COTTLE PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING.

WHEREAS, Benjamin (Benny) R. Cottle was born on October 15, 1933, to John and Della Cottle from Riddlesburg, Pennsylvania; and,

WHEREAS, Benny Cottle moved to Wasilla in the winter of 1948 driving the Alcan with his stepdad Vincent Smith, who they called Pap. Benny; and,

WHEREAS, upon arriving in Alaska, Benny and his brothers Jerry, Rodney, and Richard, lived in the homemade truck camper, building a small cook shed from logs to start their homestead; and,

WHEREAS, Benny worked at Teeland Country Store while in school, making it to the 8th grade before heading out on his own; and,

WHEREAS, Benny married his wife, Marlene, in 1952 and they enjoyed 71 years together; and,

WHEREAS, Benny and Marlene bought 110 acres in Wasilla and built a small home out of stacked railroad ties where they lived with their three children while building their current home; and,

WHEREAS, Benny was an entrepreneur who: commuted to work at the Jonesville coal mine with his truck to deliver coal in the evenings; started the first garbage hauling business in Wasilla; teamed up with his brother Jerry to build Cottles Fuel and Trucking into a successful business; and built the first self-service gas station in Wasilla; and

WHEREAS, over his many years of community involvement, Benny was an active member of Wasilla Chamber of Commerce, Pioneers of Alaska, Elks Club and served as a board member for MEA and MTA; and,

WHEREAS, Benny was one of the original people who started the Wasilla Volunteer Fire Department and was the longest serving member from 1960 to 2022; and

WHEREAS, Benny provided the land that Station 6-5 and Cottonwood Creek Elementary School sits on; and

WHEREAS, Benny helped secure the first new fire apparatus for the city of Wasilla; and

WHEREAS, Benny was instrumental in the creation of the Wasilla Fire Department, Ambulance and later Central Mat-Su Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, Benny was involved in the hiring of the first full time fire Chief; and

WHEREAS, during his decades of service, Benny held every position in the fire department at one point; and

WHEREAS, Benny Cottle provided over 60 years of service to the fire department and the citizens of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough.

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. <u>Classification</u>. This Ordinance is a noncode ordinance and is enacted notwithstanding the provisions of MSB 1.51.

Section 2. <u>Dedication and Naming of Facility</u>. In recognition of the service, devotion, and accomplishments of Benjamin (Benny) R. Cottle, the Matanuska-Susitna facility currently known as Station 6-1 is dedicated to the memory of Benny Cottle and named the Benny Cottle Public Safety Building.

Section 3. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.
