protect more than just the road, but took action to protect property outside the road easement that provides a larger buffer to protect the Old Glenn Highway. Protection measures such as bank stabilization, channelization, dikes, and revetments can be put in place well in advance of potential erosion and flooding much more cheaply than waiting for water to overtop the road. Glenn Highway Mile Post 63.5 to Mile Post 65.5 is a prime example where advance protection can help both residents near the river and allow a wider buffer of protection for the highway. On the Lower Matanuska the Old Glenn from Mile Post 13 to Mile Post 17 remains at risk and subject to the same risks and opportunities to protect as the Upper Glenn Highway. Just these two instances could cost between \$25 and \$35 million for meaningful protection for these areas for a long time to come."


