SUMMARY STATEMENT: This legislation will accept the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and the Alaska State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHS&EM) funding for the Houston Middle School Rebuild and return the School District and School Site Selection Reserve funding that was previously

appropriated to the project in order to facilitate the issuance of the contract.

BACKGROUND: On November 30, 2018, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough sustained damage to Houston Middle School due to a magnitude 7.0 earthquake.

On December 4, 2018 the Assembly approved Emergency Ordinance 18-122 to establish funding for earthquake-related expenses. It reappropriated funds from the School Site Acquisition Reserve Fund and School Bond Interest Income Fund to Fund 445, Project 55026, 2018 November Cook Inlet Earthquake-Schools.

In 2019, the Borough's primary property insurance carrier, XL America, paid a total of \$15,000,000 in insurance proceeds, which is the maximum amount allowable under the policy. Three separate payments were Accepted and Appropriated by Ordinance Serial Numbers 19-027, 19-109, and 19-132.

On September 15, 2020, the Assembly adopted Ordinance 20-087 to appropriate \$5,900,000 contributed by the school district for Houston Middle School. At this same meeting the Assembly adopted Ordinance Serial Number 20-089, condemning Houston Middle School as a fire and health hazard. As a result of the condemnation, the Scope of Work changed from a repair and replace project to a demolition and rebuild project, resulting in a claim with the excess property insurance carrier, Aspen Specialty Insurance. On March 11, 2021, the Borough successfully negotiated a settlement of \$4,600,000 with Aspen Insurance.

On March 31, 2021, the Matanuska-Susitna School Board approved Resolution 21-006, resolving to commit \$6,000,000 in Areawide School Fund Balance to rebuild Houston Middle School.

On May 4, 2021, the Assembly adopted Ordinance 21-001 which approved the following actions:

- Accept and appropriate to fund 400, project 40204, Houston Middle School Rebuild:
 - o \$4,600,000 Aspen Insurance Proceeds;
- Reappropriate from Emergency Fund 445, project 55026 to fund 400, project 40204, Houston Middle School Rebuild:
 - o \$5,900,000 Areawide Committed Fund balance;
 - o \$6,000,000 School District Fund Balance;
 - o \$15,000,000 XL American Insurance proceeds;
 - o \$1,725,446 School Bond Interest; and
 - o \$890,521 in unspent School Site Acquisition Funds.

In December 2021 the Assembly will take action on Ordinance Serial No. 21-119, accepting and appropriating \$9,000,000 from the State

of Alaska, Department of Education & Early Development into fund 400, project 40204, Houston Middle School Rebuild.

This legislation will complete the following actions:

- Accept and appropriate to fund 400, project 40204, Houston Middle School Rebuild:
 - o \$13,778,276.68 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); and
 - o \$4,592,758.89 from the Alaska State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHS&EM);
- Reappropriate \$11,900,000.00 from Houston Middle School Rebuild Fund 400, project 40204 to the School District fund 204;
- Reappropriate \$1,725,446 from Houston Middle School Rebuild Fund 400, project 40204, to Fund 300 School Bond Debt Service;
- Reappropriate \$890,521 from Houston Middle School Rebuild Fund 400, project 40204, to Fund 100 Reserve for School Site Acquisition; and
- Re-scoping \$1,500,000 in insurance proceeds from Houston Middle School Rebuild Fund 400, project 40204, to project 40205 Houston Jr/Sr High Repairs.
