SUMMARY STATEMENT: This Ordinance is sponsored by Assemblymembers Sumner, Bowles, and Gamble to update the code related to the Borough Board of Equalization ("BOE") and bring Borough Code into compliance with the updated State law.

In the past, AS 29.45.210 provided that after a hearing "If valuation is found to be too low, the board of equalization may raise the assessment." However, that language was repealed by §17 ch 28 SLA 2024 passed by the Alaska Legislature. The updated language reads "The board of equalization may not raise the assessment in the current year unless requested to do so by the appellant. If the appellant provides a long form fee appraisal to support the appellant's valuation and the board of equalization does not find in favor of the appellant, the board shall make specific findings on the record to support its decision."

This ordinance likewise repeals the prior language from Borough code and replaces it with the current language of AS 29.45.201.
