SUMMARY STATEMENT: On June 17, 2021, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Purchasing Division issued a solicitation requesting Proposals from qualified design-build teams to design and build a new underpass for the Historic Iditarod Trail where it intersects Burma Road south of Big Lake, Alaska. The intent of the project is to construct a structure that will allow for users of the Historic Iditarod Trail to cross safely from one side of Burma Road to the other avoiding interaction with vehicle traffic on the road.

Services purchased will support the Public Works Department in assembly district #5.

In response to the advertisement, four proposals were received. A proposal evaluation team made up of three Borough Public Works staff evaluated the proposals and selected K&H Constructors, LLC as the most advantageous firm for the Borough.

The substantial completion date for this project is November 1, 2021 with the final completion on June 15, 2022. In accordance with MSB $3.08.170\,(B)$, Administration requests authority to modify the resulting contract completion date by 30 days for unforeseen circumstances.

The Public Works Department, Pre-Design & Engineering Division will be administering the contract.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Project Background and Scope

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough (Borough), is requesting proposals from qualified contractors to design and build a new underpass for the Historic Iditarod Trail where it intersects Burma Road south of Big Lake, Alaska. The underpass location is within the Northeast ¼ Northeast ¼ Section 28 T16N Range 04W, Seward Meridian, and are shown in the attached map (Figure 1) and photographs (Figure 2) east of Jewell Lake. The coordinates are as follows:

Burma Road Underpass: Latitude: 61.45339 Longitude: -149.99532

This trail crossing location is within a public use easement (ADL # 222930) dedicated and managed by the State of Alaska Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The Borough has filed a land use application to the DNR to make these improvements to the trail. DNR must review and approve the design of the underpass and other improvements, prior to construction. While the Borough will be the permit holder, it is the contractor's responsibility to produce a design that satisfies the requirements of DNR. The contractor shall apply for and obtain all other permits required to complete the project, on behalf of the Borough. The other anticipated permits include, but are not limited to:

- Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), Construction General Permit
- Matanuska-Susitna Borough, Construction within Public Easements & Rights-of-Way

The intent of the project is to construct a structure that will allow for users of the Historic Iditarod Trail to cross safely from one side of Burma Road to the other avoiding interaction with vehicle traffic on the road. The project is funded through the MSB FY 2022 budget. The project budget is approximately \$700,000.

Design Criteria

At a minimum the design and construction is subject to the specifications and guidelines set forth in the AASHTO "Green Book" and the Alaska Highway Preconstruction Manual. Design criteria are summarized in Table 1 below:

If the structure is buried under the road, the design shall meet ADOT&PF Design Criteria Manual and AASHTO "Green Book" specifications to support the surface load of a typical collector level road embankment.

Project and Proposal Requirements

The contractor is responsible for investigating and evaluating all site conditions, as necessary, to design and construct the undercrossing. The MSB will supply geotechnical exploration data prior to the Notice of Successful Proposal being issued.

All engineering plans are subject to review and approval by both the Borough and the State of Alaska prior to construction. The contractor shall submit plans to the Borough for review and comment at the Plans-in-Hand (75%) and Pre-PS&E (95%) design level, and allow five (5) calendar days for review and comment by the Borough project manager. Following review and approval by the Borough, the Pre-PS&E deliverables (plan drawings, special provisions and cost estimate) will be forwarded by the Borough to the State for their approval as part of the Land Use Permit process. Final design drawings shall be sealed by a professionally licensed engineer, or land surveyor, as applicable, who is licensed in the State of Alaska, in accordance with AS 08.48

Proposals shall include all costs for design and construction. Costs of all regulatory agency reviews or permits (except for the Land Use Permit), shall be included in the proposals and will be paid directly by the Contractor to the regulatory agencies. The total cost of all construction and related required items to produce a fully functional trail crossing shall be the responsibility of the Contractor and must not exceed the bid amount. It is the responsibility of the successful Contractor to ascertain the requirements, pay any review costs, testing costs and obtain all permits necessary to construct the project for immediate use upon Substantial Completion.

<u>Warranty</u>: The Contractor shall warrant the structures and all components to be free of defects for a period of one year from the date the facility is accepted by the Owner. A minimum one-year warranty inspection is required, and a warranty statement should be included in the proposal.

<u>Project Schedule:</u> Time is of the essence. The project must be substantially completed by **November 1, 2021** with final completion by June 15, 2022. Estimated dates for draft and final plan submittals, MSB reviews, material procurement, construction commencement, substantial and final construction completion and warranty inspections shall be provided on a proposed schedule, to be included with the proposal.

Periodic design and construction progress meetings will be held, at a minimum, once per week. The Contractor shall provide meeting notes summarizing meeting discussions to the MSB within 7 calendar days of the meetings.

Notice to Proceed and Project Kick-off Meeting is anticipated to occur in August 2021.

The proposal submittal shall include:

- 1. Detailed information about the design-build team, including experience on similar projects.
- 2. List manufacturers and features of major structural components
- 3. Basic site plan showing road rights-of-way, trail easement and signage
- 4. Concept structure plans and elevations.
- 5. Structure cross sections delineating type of construction and materials used
- 6. Structure details for major components, such as pile caps abutments, etc.
- 7. Proposed schedule showing all critical milestones from NTP to a One-Year Warranty Inspection
