A RESOLUTION OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY IN SUPPORT OF GOVERNOR DUNLEAVY'S HOUSE BILL 307 AND SENATE BILL 217 TO REDUCE ARTIFICIAL BARRIERS TO NEW POWER GENERATION THAT COULD OTHERWISE

BENEFIT ALASKAN RESIDENTS.

WHEREAS, Borough residents and businesses pay some of the

highest rates in the country for electricity; and,

WHEREAS, the future supply of local natural gas, which

supplies 85 percent of Mat-Su's electricity, is uncertain and the

cost of importing natural gas could significantly increase prices;

and,

WHEREAS, Governor Dunleavy has introduced HB307 and SB217 to

help stabilize costs by eliminating artificial barriers to

building new power generation and by reducing the cost of

transmitting power through the Railbelt grid which serves

Fairbanks, Anchorage, Kenai, and Mat-Su; and,

WHEREAS, this legislation would specifically level the

playing field by amending AS 10.25.540(b) so that Independent Power

Producers to sell their power to nonprofit electric utilities are

taxed at the same rate as the utilities, and by directing the

Regulatory Commission of Alaska to revise the current system of

transmission fees charged between Railbelt

utilities to allow for the economic dispatch of the lowest-cost power at all times; and,

WHEREAS, both measures seek to reduce artificial barriers to new power generation that can otherwise deliver benefits to Alaska consumers and help stabilize energy costs for Mat-Su residents and businesses served by the Railbelt grid,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough supports passage of House Bill 307 and Senate Bill 217.
