SUMMARY STATEMENT: On December 28, 2022, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Purchasing Division issued a solicitation requesting proposals from qualified firms for facility design support, building assessments, and other related services described in the scope. The intent of the work is to efficiently support project design and development, facility assessments, and overall project planning and execution throughout the Borough on projects typically categorized as vertical construction. Services purchased will support the Public Works Department in all assembly districts.

In response to the advertisement, five proposals were received. A proposal evaluation team made up of Borough Public Works staff evaluated the proposals and selected Burkhart Croft Architects, LLC, Architects Alaska, Inc. and Stantec Architecture, Inc.as the most advantageous firms for the Borough.

These contracts provide the Project Management Division with a set of pre-qualified/pre-selected consultants, based on qualifications, for use on projects under \$50,000 from start to finish. By utilizing these agreements, consultant selection is faster and we are able to bring pricing in as a selection factor. Projects exceeding \$15,000 will be quoted between the three firms with the lowest quote being awarded the task order. It is not anticipated that annual limit will be reached on any of these contracts, however by establishing authority beyond anticipated capacity, it will allow for competition throughout the entire year.

The term length for this agreement is for one year with two additional one year renewals (potentially three-year contract), subject to annual appropriation of funds by the Borough Assembly. The initial contract period of performance begins upon contract execution ends on June 30, 2024.

In accordance with MSB 3.08.170(B), Administration requests authority to modify the resulting contract completion date by 90 days for unforeseen circumstances.

The Public Works Department, Project Management Division will be administering the contract.

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough (MSB) requests proposals from professional architectural and engineering (A/E) firms for facility design support, building assessments, and other related services described below. The intent of the work is to efficiently support project design and development, facility assessments, and overall project planning and execution throughout the Borough on projects typically categorized as vertical construction.

The MSB's intent is to enter a contract with up to three qualified firms. Once under contract, the A/E will serve as the prime consultant with various sub-consultant services as needed. Small projects under \$15,000 will be given to the next in line of the three contracted firms, starting with the firm receiving the highest ranking, then the second and third. Tasks exceeding an estimated \$15,000 will be quoted by the Purchasing Division between the three firms under contract, with the lowest quote receiving the task order. The successful firm will be required to provide a Project Manager to interface with the Borough's Project Manager in order to streamline communications and deliverables. Firms will keep communication open and respond timely to task order requests and requests for information regarding task orders.

The anticipated work load for calendar year 2023 is estimated to be less than \$1,500,000 (3 contracts not to exceed \$500,000 per year). The three individual contracts will have a task order limit of \$50,000. The work performed under these contracts is dependent on the general need, and approved project funding through the Borough budget, grants, disaster relief, and other funding sources as they become available.

These agreements will run through the 2023 calendar year from the time of execution, and may be extended for two (2) additional one-year periods by written mutual agreement of both parties. Firms will be issued a purchase order for each task order or project awarded under this contract.

Task Order Terms:

- 1. Task Orders will determine project scope of work and deliverables.
- 2. Task Orders must have the appropriate Purchase Order attached prior to commencing any work.
- 3. Multiple task orders, whether with the same or different firm are prohibited on any one project.
- 4. All task orders may be issued on a lump sum or T&M Not to Exceed cost basis.
- 5. All Task Orders will have a firm completion/deliverable date.
- 6. Task Orders may have a total length of time to complete of 18 months from date of issue. All terms and conditions will remain in effect throughout the performance of a Task Order regardless of term contract 23-035P time of performance.
