A RESOLUTION OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY REINSTATING FREE DISPOSAL OF LIMITED AMOUNTS OF RESIDENTIAL HAZARDOUS WASTE AT THE CENTRAL LANDFILL FOR MOTOR OIL, LATEX PAINT, VEHICLE BATTERIES, ANTIFREEZE, AND COOKING OIL.

WHEREAS, the intent and rational of this legislation is to reinstate free disposal of a limited amount of residential hazardous waste at the Central Landfill, as set forth in IM No. 21-229.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Assembly adopts the following changes to the Fiscal Year 2022 Schedule of Rates and Fees in order to reinstate free disposal in each category below and as designated by the bold underlined words in each line item:
