SUMMARY STATEMENT: On behalf of the Department of Emergency Services, an application for reallocation of HSGP Grant funds was presented to the Borough Manager for signature and then submitted to the Alaska Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management.

The purpose of the application is funding to cover the software and training for the new unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) that will allow the Mat-Su Borough Hazardous Material (HazMat) team to safely and efficiently approach a HazMat incident for reconnaissance and planning purposes. This will also allow for the monitoring, mapping a planning activities during natural disasters, such as wildfires, floods and earthquakes.

1. Provide a brief project description and explain why this project is important to the community? Purchase a UAV and train UAV pilots. This purchase will allow the Mat Su Borough's HazMat team to safely and efficiently approach a HazMat incident for recon and planning purposes, record response for safety and training purposes along with providing documentation for law enforcement and legal purposes. This project would also allow the MSB to accurately monitor, map and plan during wildfires, earthquakes with impassable roads and flooded area that are inaccessible.

Based on supply chain problems and COVID, the amount awarded is less than is needed to complete the purchase of the UAV and training. This additional funding will allow for the training portion of the specific UAV to be completed.

This includes a UAV cost overage of \$55.02 of the estimated cost.

UAV will be purchased by the end of the performance period, based on Assembly acceptance time period of 4-6 weeks.
