SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Matanuska-Susitna Borough School District (MSBSD) has allocated \$10,500,000 to the Mat-Su Central School Construction project, this legislation will accept that funding. In addition, this legislation will reappropriate \$3,000,000 from the School Debt Service fund for the same purpose.

BACKGROUND:

Mat-Su Central School is the largest school in the MSBSD, serving over 2,300 students, and enrollment continued to increase. The MSBSD has leased the Mat-Su Central School's Wasilla location from

a private entity for the past 30 years and with the increasing enrollment they have outgrown the facility.

The MSBSD currently spends \$583,954 each year to lease commercial space in Palmer and Wasilla for Mat-Su Central School with annual escalation clauses of 3% and 2%, respectively. With the lease on the Wasilla location set to expire on June 30, 2024, with an additional two year renewal option, it has been determined that construction of a new facility is in the best interest of the School, the School District, and the Mat-Su Borough.

On March 2, 2022, the MSBSD committed \$11,900,000 to the District's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Fund for the design and construction of Mat-Su Central School, and in June approved a contract for the design of the new school.

The MSBSD requested that the Mat-Su Borough place a bond package for the construction of the new facility on the ballot. In August the Borough Manger proposed a plan for construction of the Mat-Su Central School that would avoid debt issuance.

The total construction is estimated at \$22,700,000 with an additional \$1,300,000 for furniture, fixtures, and equipment (FF&E) bringing the total estimate to \$24,000,000. Funding for construction, without FF&E has been allocated as shown here:

Dear Mr. Brown:

Thank you for attending our School Board Work Session on September 28, 2022 to discuss various aspects of the Borough's funding proposal for Mat-Su Central School, as outlined within your letter dated August 29, 2022.

The School Board approved Resolution 23-002 during its Regular School Board Meeting on Wednesday, October 5, 2022. In doing so, the School Board authorized \$10.5 million to be transferred to the Mat-Su Borough for the construction of Mat-Su Central School. In addition to this funding authorization, the School Board requests to modify the Borough's proposal so the following components, totaling \$7.7 million, are contributed by the District over a period of 13 years after occupancy:

- \$3.0 million as an upfront investment by the School District;
- \$3.4 million as a loan by the Borough to be repaid over 5 years; and
- \$1.3 million towards furniture, fixtures, and equipment (FF&E).

Finally, the School Board requests that both bodies make similar funding requests of the Alaska Legislature for a direct appropriation to fund the new construction for Mat-Su Central. If any Federal or State appropriated funds are approved for this project, the School Board desires to see its initial investment of \$10.5 million be replenished by the Borough.

Thank you for your time and consideration. We are encouraged to see a funding proposal that averts unnecessary financing costs, eliminates the need for costly operating leases, and delivers a much needed resource to our families.

MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH SCHOOL BOARD RESOLUTION 23-002

A RESOLUTION OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH SCHOOL BOARD SUPPORTS THE AUTHORIZATION OF A \$10,500,000 TRANSFER TO THE MAT-SU BOROUGH FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF MAT-SU CENTRAL SCHOOL.

WHEREAS, Mat-Su Central School is the largest school in the Mat-Su Borough School District (District), serving over 2,300 students; and

WHEREAS, in the last ten years, Mat-Su Central School's enrollment has increased by 700 students; and

WHEREAS, Mat-Su Central School offers a hybrid learning model with many on-site courses; and

WHEREAS, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough School District has leased Mat-Su Central School's Wasilla location from a private entity for the past 30 years and has outgrown the facility; and

WHEREAS, the Wasilla location lease agreement is set to expire on June 30, 2024 with the option for renew for an additional two years; and

WHEREAS, the Mat-Su Borough School District spends \$583,954 each year to lease commercial space in Palmer and Wasilla for Mat-Su Central School with annual escalation clauses of 3% and 2%, respectively; and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2022, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough School District (District) committed \$11,900,000 to the District's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Fund for the design and construction of Mat-Su Central School; and

WHEREAS, on June 1, 2022, the Mat-Su Borough School District School Board approved a contract with MCG Explore Design to design Mat-Su Central School for approximately \$1.4 million to be paid from the committed funds; and

WHEREAS, the District received a letter from the Mat-Su Borough on August 29, 2022 that proposed a plan for Mat-Su Central School funding that would avoid debt issuance; and

WHEREAS, this plan requested the District make available its remaining committed funds of \$10.5 million; an additional \$3 million in current year resources; \$3.4 million over the next five years; and \$1.3 million for furniture, fixtures, and equipment (FF&E) to support the construction of Mat-Su Central School; and

WHEREAS, with limited resources to fund current operations, the District supports a modified funding proposal, requiring a \$10.5 million upfront investment with \$7.7 million being contributed to the project over the next 13 years; and

WHEREAS, if the construction project is under its estimated budget of \$24 million at completion, the District would reduce its financial support by the same amount; and

WHEREAS, if the construction project exceeds its estimated budget of \$24 million, the District would expect the Borough to cover cost overruns; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mat-Su Borough and the District both make similar funding requests from the Alaska Legislature for construction funds for Mat-Su Central School.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that any funds received by the Mat-Su Borough from State or Federal sources for this project will be used to replenish the \$10.5 million.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Matanuska-Susitna Borough School Board supports the authorization of a \$10,500,000 transfer to the Mat-Su Borough for the construction of Mat-Su Central School with \$7.7 million being paid to the Borough over 13 years following the completion of the project.
