SUMMARY STATEMENT: The Operations & Maintenance Division requests occupied, budgeted the convert authorization to Utilities/Facilities Maintenance Laborer On-Call position to a full-time Utilities/Facilities Maintenance Laborer position for Talkeetna Sewer & Water (TSW), beginning on December 19, 2022. The conversion of this on-call position to a full-time position will provide additional support to the two Talkeetna Sewer & Water Operators and is needed as a result of increasing operational & maintenance demands within the Talkeetna Sewer & Water Service Area.

The demands of the Talkeetna Sewer & Water Service Area have increased significantly over the last several years. The service area is rapidly growing to accommodate new community members and increasing seasonal tourism.

In 2020, the Wastewater Treatment Plant was brought online, an addition to the wastewater lagoons, to meet Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation water quality requirements. The treatment plant involves regular monitoring and adjustments to ensure water quality factors are meeting discharge permit requirements. The new facility requires maintenance on additional chemical and transfer pumps, water quality equipment, and overall site maintenance.

New service connections are being added every year while old accounts are regularly audited to ensure services are properly inventoried, specifically re-classifying residential accounts to commercial. The GIS Department is currently creating a map of Service Area infrastructure to assist in providing an accurate catalog of all system assets including water & sewer mainlines, valves, manholes, service connections, etc. However, TSW Operators will be responsible for the physical collection of the data points GIS needs to complete the mapping project. This requires locating each point with special locating equipment such as a metal detector or utilizing as-built drawings and other historical notes then, if below grade, excavating the asset.

Recently, the Service Area has been added to Alaska811 Digline, a service for utility locate requests, which requires timely identification by TSW Operators of water & sewer mainlines and service connections in order to prevent damage from planned underground excavation work. TSW Operators utilize equipment drawings and as-built plus occasional verification of below grade assets to complete locate requests. Locate requests typically take several hours or more to complete depending on the complexity of the in-ground infrastructure.

The Talkeetna Sewer & Water Fiscal Year 2023 (FY23) operating budget included \$15,000 to fund the on call position. The Talkeetna Sewer & Water FY23 Operating Budget has \$30,845 available to cover the cost of converting this on-call position to a full-time position for the remainder of FY23. The full-time position will remain as a permanent position and the anticipated base wage and burdens of \$83,700 will be included in the FY2024 Talkeetna Sewer and Water Operating Budget, and the funding for the on-call position will be removed, resulting in an anticipated increase in the wages and burdens of \$68,700.

DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Assist in brush cutting activities for all Talkeetna Sewer and Water including lagoons, treatment plants, lift stations, fire hydrants, etc.
- Assist in snow removal for all Talkeetna Sewer and Water facilities.
- Assist in regular facility maintenance including inspection, cleaning, painting, etc.
- · Assist in the inspection, maintenance, and cleaning of sewer lift stations.
- · Assist in locating sewer and water system lines, man holes, valves, etc.
- · Assist in water main flushing.
- · Assist in water valve repairs including excavations.
- · Assist in backwashing water filters.
- · Assist in installing or repairing metering equipment.

- · Assist in seasonally bringing the wastewater plant online/offline.
