**MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH  
ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 17-030**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING \$355,000 FROM THE ALASKA SUSTAINABLE SALMON FUND TO FUND 410, PROJECT NO. 30114, FOR 5 CULVERT REPLACEMENTS AS PART OF THE FISH PASSAGE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT, PROJECT NO. 30114

WHEREAS, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough was notified by the Alaska Sustainable Salmon Fund that a grant project was approved in the amount of \$355,000 to replace 5 culverts; and

WHEREAS, the funds under this agreement will be used to design, permit, bid, construct, and replace identified fish barrier culverts with fish-passage culverts; and

WHEREAS, the required Borough match is \$127,046; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly has set aside \$600,000 in areawide funds as part of the fiscal year 2012 capital projects budget for the purpose of matching United States Fish and Wildlife Service and Alaska state grants; and

WHEREAS, Resolution Serial No. 16-067 was approved to amend the scope to allow grant match to any entity; and

WHEREAS, the Operations and Maintenance Division would like to identify \$127,046 of these funds as match for this project; and

WHEREAS, no expenditures can be made until a scope of work and budget has been approved by the Assembly.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. Classification. This Ordinance is a non-code ordinance.

Section 2. Acceptance and appropriation source. There is hereby accepted and appropriated by the Assembly, \$355,000 from the Alaska Sustainable Salmon Fund, to fund 410, project no. 30114, for 5 culvert replacements as part of the Fish Passage Culvert Replacement Project.

Section 3. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.
