MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 17-072

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING A \$7,484.80 ALASKA STATE DIVISION OF FORESTRY VOLUNTEER FIRE ASSISTANCE GRANT AND REQUESTING A REAPPROPRIATION OF \$831.64 FROM THE WEST LAKES FIRE SERVICE AREA FISCAL YEAR 2017 OPERATING BUDGET, FUND 249, TO PROJECT NO. 20151, FUND 405, FOR FIRE EQUIPMENT AND CLOTHING.

WHEREAS, the Borough has been notified that the West Lakes Fire Service Area has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$7,484.80 from the Alaska State Division of Forestry, under the Volunteer Fire Assistance Program; and

WHEREAS, the fire service area is required to provide matching funds in the amount of \$831.64 in order to comply with the conditions of the grant and to receive the grant; and

WHEREAS, the scope of work and budget are contained in Resolution Serial No. 17-041; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance and appropriation of the grant funds serves a public interest.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. Classification. This is a non-code ordinance.

Section 2. Grant acceptance. The Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly does hereby authorize the acceptance of a grant from the

Alaska State Division of Forestry and agrees to comply with the applicable provisions.

Section 3. Appropriation and reappropriation source. The Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly hereby appropriates the amount of \$7,484.80 from the Alaska State Division of Forestry Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant Program and reappropriates the amount of \$831.64 from the West Lakes Fire Service Area Fiscal Year 2017 Operating Budget, fund 249, to project no. 20151, fund 405, for fire equipment and clothing.

Section 4. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.
