## SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Caswell Fire Service area is using a very outdated engine that is 38 years old and the maintenance, safety, and reliability of this vehicle is of concern during a response.

The fire service area has the opportunity to purchase a used pumper from Anchorage Fire Department through their auction/bid process and this seems to be a very prudent and cost effective way to replace an aging vehicle. The Emergency Services Fleet Mechanic has inspected the auction vehicle and stated that it seems to be in good running order with only minor repairs or maintenance needed.

The Caswell Fire Service Area Fire Chief and the Caswell Fire Service Area Board of Supervisors has requested an \$85,000 fund balance appropriation to project 45238 for the purchase, repairs, and updates of a pumper vehicle, and purchase of any

related equipment.

## Borough Assembly;

The Caswell Fire Service Area's Board of Supervisors hereby recommends that up to \$85,000 of Caswell Fire Service Area's fund balance be transferred into a project fund and be used to acquire, repair and outfit the 2004 KME four-wheel drive 1500 GPM pumper which is to be sold at action by the Anchorage Fire Department. The DES lead mechanic, Howard Smith, has been into Anchorage and inspected the engine, looked at the maintenance records and spoken to Anchorage Fire Department mechanic about the engine and any needed repairs. Mr. Smith has informed us that the engine is in good running order with only minor repairs and maintenance to be completed. This is a very cost effective way to replace our aging engine without spending \$400,000 dollars on a new engine.

The engine being replaced is our 1979 Emergency-One engine that was donated to the department by the Central Mat-Su Fire Department. The engine has cost the department a substantial amount of money the past few years due to continual repair and maintenance needs. An example being, during last year's pumper service testing, our crew had no choice but to abort the test because the engine continually overheated making it impossible to complete the yearly testing. In our 2012-2016 Strategic Initiatives this apparatus was identified as needing replaced.
