SUMMARY STATEMENT:

During the 2008 legislative session a bill was passed that would allow a portion of the Fiscal Year 2009 Community Revenue Sharing Program funds to be passed through to unincorporated areas. The program was also funded for Fiscal Year 2010, Fiscal Year 2011, Fiscal Year 2012, Fiscal Year 2013, Fiscal Year 2014, Fiscal Year 2015, Fiscal Year 2016, Fiscal Year 2017, and Fiscal Year 2018. For the Fiscal Year 2019 program, the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development is requiring that a resolution be adopted by the governing body to approve the participating unincorporated communities for the program prior to June 15, 2018.

To qualify for the program, the communities must have at least 25 residents and pay for three of the following services: fire protection, emergency medical, water and sewer, solid waste management, public road or ice road maintenance, public health, and search and rescue. The grant to each unincorporated area can

only be spent for the public benefit of the unincorporated area. Once the amount of funding is known, an ordinance will be presented to the Assembly to accept and appropriate the funds.

The following unincorporated communities and their respective incorporated nonprofit entities are eligible for funding under the Fiscal Year 2019 Community Assistance Program:

Some examples of the scopes of work that community councils have previously submitted for the program are as follows:

- Providing funds for community food banks to purchase food and transportation of goods.
- Replace bridges on trails using pressure treated lumber.
- Trail maintenance including straightening out dangerous curves, grooming the trails, and putting up signage.
- Providing funds to libraries for teen and preschool programs.
- Construction of pavilions in local parks.
- Construction of an open air amphitheater.
- Providing funds for the operations of My House, a nonprofit helping the Mat Su Valley's homeless youth.
- Providing training and equipment for local fire stations.
- Repairs to boat ramps at the public launch area.
- Purchase of satellite phones for emergency response communication.
- Providing educational classes as a means to reach the community youth and adults with programs that teach outdoor safety, senior safety and healthy living.
- Sports field maintenance including maintenance of lawns, equipment and access trails and road.
- Planning, preparation, and construction of community parks and community center buildings.
- Providing medical bags and supplies to local schools.
- Providing funding to weather-proof recycling containers and building a platform for accessibility to the containers.
- Providing funding and training for the Neighborhood Watch program and for signage.

Adopt the attached legislation that will approve unincorporated communities for participation in the Fiscal Year 2019 Community Assistance Program.
