A RESOLUTION OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY APPROVING THE SCOPE OF WORK AND BUDGET FOR PROJECT NO. 45286, TO ALLOW FOR THE LAND PREP AND CONSTRUCTION, AND FURNISHINGS AND EQUIPMENT, FOR A NEW EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES STATION 11-9 IN TALKEETNA.

WHEREAS, in response to the growing population and tourism in the northern region of the Borough, the demand for emergency medical services support has increased significantly; and

WHEREAS, we have expanded coverage to include a staff with a response vehicle at EMS Station 11-2 at mile 99 of the Parks Highway; and

WHEREAS, we have also expanded staff shifts to man this station's ambulance to improve response times; and

WHEREAS, the space available at Station 11-2 is substandard, and staff sleeping in office cubicles in the training room is unacceptable; and

WHEREAS, building a new, single story, two bay station adjacent to Station 11-2 on Borough owned property is the best option to mitigate crew quarters concerns; and

WHEREAS, funds in the amount of \$1,400,000 to build a new EMS Station 11-9 were appropriated to project no. 45286, with Assembly adoption of Ordinance Serial No. 18-016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Assembly hereby approves the scope of work and budget for project no. 45286 as follows.

SCOPE OF WORK

Land preparation and construction, and furnishings and equipment, for a new Emergency Medical Services Station 11-9 in Talkeetna.
