**MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH
ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 19-005**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING SEPTEMBER 2012 SOUTHCENTRAL FLOOD DISASTER RELIEF MONIES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$51,920 FROM THE ALASKA STATE DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO FUND 445, PROJECT NO. 55017.

WHEREAS, in September of 2012, due to heavy rains in the area, the Borough sustained boroughwide flood damages; and

WHEREAS, a disaster declaration was issued by the Mayor and the Manager; and

WHEREAS, the occurrence was also declared a disaster by President Obama and a large portion of the costs incurred during the disaster were determined as eligible for state and federal funding assistance; and

WHEREAS, to date, the Borough has been awarded \$3,387,628 of disaster relief funds; and

WHEREAS, an alternate project was approved for Shirley Town Bridge; and

WHEREAS, \$51,920 has been designated for the first phase of the project to include estimated survey, engineering, and permitting costs; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly must accept and appropriate the grant funds prior to expenditures.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. Classification. This Ordinance is a noncode ordinance.


Section 2. Acceptance and appropriation source. The Assembly does hereby authorize the acceptance of and appropriates the September 2012 Southcentral Flood disaster relief monies in the amount of \$51,920 from the Alaska State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management and the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Section 3. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.
