| PERMIT TERMS AND | CONDITIONS |

PERMIT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PERMIT – The permit grants personal intermittent use of the lands owned by the Matanuska-Susitna Borough as specified on the upper section of this permit. Commercial use is prohibited. The property may not be used more then seven (7) consecutive days or more than twenty-one (21) total days in a twelve (12) month period.

REGULATIONS – The permit holder is responsible for compliance with all local, state and federal laws. The permit holder agrees to indemnify and obtain the necessary approvals from third party interests and obtain all permits or written authorization required by the applicable laws, rules, and regulations from governing authorities.



Matanuska-Susitna Borough Personal Intermittent Use Permit

This permit is issued in accordance to MSB 23.10.100 (A) (2) and PPM – Part 50 3.1 (A) and (B) and subject to attached general conditions and special instructions

LOCATION – The permit holder is responsible for properly locating their activity on the permitted lands.

LAND AND RESOURCES – The permit holder agrees to conduct all activities related to this permit in a manner that will minimize disturbance to the land and resources. Only dead and down wood may be taken for use with the activities associated with this permit. The permit holder further agrees not to harass wildlife or disturb their natural habitat.

WASTE – All solid waste and foreign debris, including incinerated remains, shall be removed from the property. No refuse, trash or other materials may be buried on the property or discharged into any water body. Greywater from washing shall be dispersed into well drained soils a minimum of seventy-five (75) feet from any water body. Scatter ashes and blackened rocks from campfires.

SANITATION – The property shall be kept clean. Prior to removal, all garbage and debris will be stored so as not to attract wildlife. Food shall be stored in bear-proof containers. Unwanted food or scrapings from dishes shall be burned when possible.

FIRE - The permit holder shall exercise caution in the use of fires. Camp stoves shall be used when the danger of fire exists. The permit holder shall obtain a burn permit from the State of Alaska, Department of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry if necessary. Guidelines for containment and suppression shall be strictly followed. Wildfires shall be reported immediately to the Division of Forestry.

FIREARMS – Firearms may not be discharged on the property unless it is necessary for personal protection or the permit holder is a licensed hunter and is lawfully pursuing game.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES – All motorized vehicles, with the exception of snow machines, are restricted to travel along existing, authorized trails and roads.

FUEL – The storage of petroleum products is prohibited on the property. Spills or contamination of the water or land will be controlled and recovered immediately and reported to the State of Alaska, Department of Environmental Conservation and the Matanuska-Susitna Borough by the permit holder.
