## MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 20-034

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING 2018 COOK INLET EARTHQUAKE DISASTER RELIEF MONIES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$233,138.10 FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) AND \$77,712.69 FROM THE ALASKA STATE DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT (DHS&EM), TO FUND 445, PROJECT NO. 55026.

WHEREAS, On November 30, 2018, the Borough sustained severe damages to roads, schools, public facilities, and infrastructure due to a magnitude 7.0 earthquake; and

WHEREAS, local, state, and federal disaster declarations were issued; and

WHEREAS, costs incurred during the disaster were determined to be eligible for state (25 percent) and federal (75 percent) funding assistance; and

WHEREAS, projects have been identified and funds obligated for a portion of the 2018 Cook Inlet Earthquake; and

WHEREAS, project worksheets to accept and appropriate through this legislation are for School District Wide Contents and Equipment and the Northern Area Schools; and

WHEREAS, additional legislation will be brought forward until all eligible projects have been awarded.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. Classification. This is a noncode ordinance.

Section 2. Acceptance and Appropriation source. The Assembly does hereby authorize the acceptance and appropriation of the 2018 Cook Inlet Earthquake disaster relief monies to fund 445 in the amount of \$310,850.79 for project no. 55026 (School District) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Alaska State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHS&EM).

Section 4. <u>Effective date</u>. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.
