## SUMMARY STATEMENT:

On August 18, 2020, the Assembly accepted and appropriated a grant from the State of Alaska, Department of Health and Social Services in the amount of \$296,807 with a required match of \$127,203.

The borough released a notice in February 2020 requesting applications from non-profit agencies providing essential health and human services to residents within the Matanuska-Susitna Borough. This application period was extended twice due to the COVID-19 restrictions, with a final submittal deadline of June 1, 2020. There were 14 applications submitted prior to the deadline. These applications, along with scoring criteria, were provided to two groups of volunteers, for scoring. Volunteers included the health and social services board members and a number of borough employees.

The health and social services board met on September 3, 2020, to determine funding recommendations. After considerable discussion, there was a unanimous decision to fund the top 10 scoring applications at 94.2% of their request with the remaining \$110.00 going to the top scoring application.
