**SUMMARY STATEMENT:** This ordinance is sponsored by Mayor Halter to place a ballot question before the voters to reclassify the Matanuska-Susitna Borough from a second class borough to a first class borough. Under AS 29.04.050, a second class borough may reclassify as a first class borough by submitting the question to the voters.

The subject of municipal powers is an extremely complex area of Alaska law and therefore, this informational memorandum addresses these concepts very broadly.

Currently, the MSB is a second class borough. Second class boroughs have several areawide powers which they exercise everywhere in the borough including within city limits. Second class boroughs also have a list of several non-areawide powers which can be exercised in the borough but only outside the city limits.

Generally speaking, if the MSB becomes a first class borough, the MSB's areawide powers would not change and the MSB would be able to exercise powers within city limits no differently than it currently does such as ambulance service, education, assessment, and taxation. The relationship with the cities would not change. However, if the MSB becomes a first class borough, instead of a list of non-areawide powers, the MSB would be able to exercise any power not prohibited by law in the area outside the cities. It is very important to note that simply becoming a first class borough does not automatically affect the MSB's current areawide powers, does not affect the powers of the cities, and does not automatically affect existing service areas. Service areas exist in code and would not be automatically changed by the MSB becoming a first class borough.

This proposition is not related in any way to home rule powers. Home rule powers are a different set of powers and would require additional voter approvals. In addition, if home rule powers were pursued and acquired, they would impact the relationship with the cities. This ordinance does not change the relationship between the MSB and the cities of Palmer, Wasilla, and Houston.

In conclusion, the major effect of becoming a first class borough is that the MSB would be able to exercise any power not prohibited by law in the area outside cities. This means that the MSB would not have to seek voter approval to do things like police protection, fire response outside existing service areas, health regulations, business regulations, and/or road powers outside existing service areas. If the MSB becomes a first class borough, it would be able to exercise powers outside the cities without needing additional permission from voters to do so.
