**SUMMARY STATEMENT:** On November 30, 2018 the Matanuska-Susitna Borough sustained damage to infrastructure due to a magnitude 7.0 earthquake. A borough, state and federal disaster declaration was issued for November 30, 2018. Allowed costs are eligible for 75% federal and 25% state funding assistance.

In February 2020, Project Worksheet 161 (PW161) was awarded for a total of \$162,070.96 for emergency work performed in response to damages caused by the earthquake at Colony High School. Following this award, it was discovered that costs totaling \$2,058.09 for lighting and flooring were paid but not included in the original worksheet. Additionally, when the school tried to fire up the gas kiln, they discovered it had also been damaged in the earthquake and needed to be replaced. The cost to replace the kiln is \$47,670.

Amendment No. 1 was issued to increase the project costs of PW161 for Colony High School by a total of \$49,728.09 for the kiln replacement, lighting and flooring cost overrun, and extend the grant performance period to July 31, 2021. These additional funds bring the total award for Colony High School to \$211,799.05.
