C. Discussion of Potential Road Bond Projects

21-148 Road Bond Discussion Handouts

Mr. Brown expressed congratulations to Adam Bradway, Planner II, recipient of the Emerging Planner of the Year from the American Planning Association Alaska.

The following people presented on the potential road bond projects: Mike Brown, Borough Manager; Brad Sworts, Pre-Design and Engineering Division Manager; Adam Bradway, Planner II; Cheyenne Heindel, Finance Director; and Nick Spiropoulos, Borough Attorney.

Assemblymember Sumner moved to direct the manager to bring two separate pieces of legislation. One for a \$78 million dollar road bond transportation package including 49th State Street and the other for a sales tax to be introduced July 20, 2021.

AAssemblymember Sumner moved a primary amendment by removing the \$5,500,000 for the Seldon Road from the road bond projects.

Assemblymember Sumner moved to withdraw the primary amendment.

Mr. Brown thanked staff for all the work they did on the proposal.

Assemblymember Nowers appreciated having the discussion ahead of time, the initiative and getting the public involved early in the process so they feel engaged.

Assemblymember Yundt gave thanks to Mayor Ledford, city of Wasilla, for being at the meeting and providing feedback. Expressed the need for being transparent and correctly show what going to do.

Assemblymember Hale spoke to a productive discussion and thanked staff.

Assemblymember Boeve expressed there are a lot of valuable projects not moving forward and it was not an easy decision.

Mayor Halter at critical point for road....problem lack of infrastructure. 45-60 million is more appropriate. How funding is most important. Need to clarify how we are funding when voters on vote on it, can have success. Like idea of sunset and keeping the total amount of projects low. Projects are worthy....parrticular interest in projects from 2018 that fell through the cracks.
