**SUMMARY STATEMENT:** This ordinance is sponsored by the Borough Manager to codify the Borough's power to restrict on the use of motorized equipment on certain lakes and waterways within the Matanuska-Susitna Borough.

Currently, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough restricts motorized equipment on lakes and waterways. However, the power to do so is not expressly stated in the Code, even though voters passed this proposition in 1994. Therefore, this power should be codified in the Code.

DISCUSSION: In a special borough election on February 1, 1994, Matanuska-Susitna Borough voters passed the proposition to restrict motorized equipment on lakes and waterways. Below is the exact language:

"PROPOSITION NO. 1 - RESTRICTION OF MOTORIZED EQUIPMENT

Shall an ordinance be adopted to provide a restriction on the use of motorized equipment on certain lakes and waterways within the Matanuska-Susitna Borough?"

The Proposition passed with 3,424 votes in favor to 3,153 votes against. While the voters adopted this proposition in the special election, the power never made it into the list of powers in Chapter 1.10 of the Borough code.

Currently, there are code sections that describe lake management, such as:

MSB 17.58 MOTORIZED USES ON LAKES AND WATERWAYS;

MSB 17.59 LAKE MANAGEMENT PLAN IMPLEMENTATION;

MSB 15.24.030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAND AND PURPOSES; and

MSB 15.24.031 INITIATING AND AMENDING LAKE MANAGEMENT PLANS.

In the MSB Code, areawide powers are listed in "ARTICLE II. AREAWIDE POWERS" beginning at MSB 1.10.100. The power to restrict motorized equipment on lakes and waterways ordinance should be added to this section of the code, so that the code adequately reflects this power.

#### MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 93-/32

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY PLACING AN INITIATIVE QUESTION ON THE BALLOT AT A SPECIAL ELECTION.

WHEREAS, an initiative petition seeking to amend MSB 17.58 to provide a restriction on the use of motorized equipment on certain lakes and waterways within the Matanuska-Susitna Borough was filed with the clerk on November 10, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the initiative petition meets the requirements of AS 29.26.130 and AS 29.26.140; and

WHEREAS, the clerk certified the petition on November 19, 1993; and

WHEREAS, AS 29.26.170 requires the clerk to submit the matters to the voters at a special election within 75 days, but not sooner than 45 days after certification.

BE IT ENACTED:

\*Section 1. <u>Classification</u>. Section 2 of this ordinance is of general and permanent nature and shall become a part of the borough code. Sections 1, 3, and 4 are non-code ordinances.

\*Section 2. Adoption of chapter. MSB 17.58, Motorized Uses on Lakes and Waterways, is adopted.

\*Section 3. <u>Submission to the voters</u>. The borough clerk is directed to place before the voters at a special borough election on February 1, 1994, the question of whether an ordinance be approved to restrict use of motorized equipment on certain lakes and waterways. The ballot proposition submitted to the voters shall read substantially as follows:
