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VIII. MAYOR, ASSEMBLY, AND STAFF COMMENT

Assemblymember Sumner spoke to his appreciation of going through the budget deliberation process. Thanked the body for the meeting.

Assemblymember Leonard thanked Mayor Halter for advising the body about funds needed for the Veteran's Memorial Wall. Stated that he appreciates the Borough being a partner with the city of Wasilla in caring for the memorial. Stated that although he supports the process of budget deliberations, he is disappointed that he was unable to keep the mill rate at 10.331. Spoke in opposition to increasing taxes as a way to increase revenue.

Assemblymember Sykes thanked the body for their hard work on the budget. Noted that the Assembly is a diverse group who often see things from different perspectives. Stated he is glad they can work together. Stated that he is hopeful that the State Legislature will support the 70/30 split on debt reimbursement.

Assemblymember Boeve thanked staff for all their hard work on the budget. Opined that it had been challenging and is not likely over yet. Stated that she appreciates staff's perseverance and dedication to working for residents in the Borough.

Assemblymember Mayfield thanked the body for their participation in the budget process. Noted that they did not agree on the final product, but he feels that a good budget was adopted.

Assemblymember Beck stated that he is thankful to have been a part of this year's budget process. Noted that although he did not agree with all of Assemblymember Sumner's amendments, he thought that his points were presented thoughtfully. Thanked staff for all their hard work on behalf of Borough residents. Thanked Ms. Heindel for all her expertise. Stated that he is grateful this is his last budget season.

Assemblymember Sumner recognized Ms. Bonnie Quill, Mat-Su Convention and Visitor's Bureau, who was sitting in the audience. Stated that he does not think they are squandering funds as much as he did before the budget process. Thanked the body for the meeting.

Mayor Halter expressed concern that the State Legislature has not yet adopted a budget. Spoke to how reserve funds could be impacted by 70/30 or 50/50 split. Noted that if it is zero, then the Borough will have problems. Opined that it was a professional amendment process. Spoke in support of the amendments being turned in early. Opined that they were well written

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and organized. Stated that Ms. Kilborn and Ms. Henry did a sensational job. Stated that he is happy the budget is adopted. Spoke to the beautiful wreath that Ms. Tiffany Richards, his staff support, ordered for the Memorial Day ceremony at the Veteran's Memorial Wall.

IX. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at 9:35 p.m.

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
