Spoke to a meeting with Emergency Medical Services that she attended. Related that there have been 10,000 overdose cases in 2019. Stated that she is looking forward to meeting with the School Board and to the planning session this weekend. Opined that the 2010 Strategic Economic Development Plan should be looked at for ideas to be discussed at the Planning Session.

Assemblymember Mayfield noted that the procurement issue has always been a concern of the Assembly. Stated that he does not blame Mr. Moosey for trying to improve the procurement process. Opined that Ordinance Serial No. 20-009 is Federal procurement regulations on steroids that went way beyond the requirements of the Code of Federal Regulations. Stated that he is glad the body postponed it indefinitely. Congratulated Ms. Heindel and the Finance Department on award they were presented with this evening.

Mayor Halter requested that Mr. Moosey to invite Mr. John Wood to attend next meeting to provide an update on the Fisheries Board meeting that was held in Kodiak. Requested a report on the expenses associated with the Shirley Towne Bridge. Stated that he is looking forward to seeing how the planning session will go.
