Requested information on how public notices occur when they are sent out via U.S. Mail and how the addresses those notices are sent to are selected. Noted that for the elections discussion meeting in January that she would like to know the cost of the hand count and the time involved, a State representative to answer questions regarding voter rolls, the cost of a less costly tabulator without all the bells and whistles, and any insight that could be provided regarding procedures on what the hand count at each precinct will look like.

Assemblymember Yundt spoke to concerns with on-site cannabis consumption. Noted that he would support it when it comes forward if there was a way for law enforcement to test intoxication.

Assemblymember Hale opined that the vote for the Beverly Lake Management Plan was a tough one. Stated that having voting processes in place are important. Spoke in opposition of forcing someone into a lake management plan. Opined that a standard for the number of votes needs to be put into place that is similar to local improvement districts.

Assemblymember Tew thanked Kelsey Anderson for her attention to detail in developing the Beverly Lake Management Plan.

Assemblymember Bernier wished Assemblymember Sumner the best with his transition to the State Legislature. Said a prayer.
