SUMMARY STATEMENT: On January 21, 2026, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Purchasing Division issued a solicitation requesting bids from qualified contractors to perform annual road maintenance for Road Service Area (RSA) 14, Fairview. Contractors are to provide services to the Borough for all road assets approved for maintenance within the Road Service Area (RSA). Contract Services are comprised of three general activities: Routine Maintenance, Periodic Maintenance, and Public Construction. Services purchased will support the Public Works Department in assembly district #3.

In response to the advertisement, two bids were received. Award recommendation is being made to Battleground, LLC as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder based on Total Bid Amount.

The total award amount is based on the cost of Annual Routine Maintenance (basic summer and winter maintenance) Periodic Maintenance (Cracksealing, Striping, etc.) and Public Construction.

The amount represented in this legislation is broken down as follows:

Routine Maintenance	\$672,600.00
Periodic Maintenance	\$ 55,400.00
Public Construction	\$199,760.00

Public Construction and Periodic Maintenance are done through issuance of individual task orders on an as-needed basis under the 3-year work plan.

The term length for this agreement is for one year with two additional one-year renewals (potentially three-year contract), subject to annual appropriation of funds by the Borough Assembly.

In accordance with MSB 3.08.170(B), Administration requests authority to modify the resulting contract completion date by 90 days for unforeseen circumstances.

The Public Works Department, Operations & Maintenance Division, will be administering the contract.

SECTION 102

SCOPE OF WORK

- 2.0 Description.** The work consists of performing year-round routine maintenance. Work may also consist of periodic maintenance or public construction that is approved by the Borough prior to commencement. The Contractor shall complete all work in accordance with the Contract.
- 2.1 Roads Approved for Maintenance.** The Borough's GIS dashboard (<https://matsugov.us/roads/maintenance>) identifies the road service area (RSA) boundary and the road maintenance classifications included in this Contract. Mileage shown in the bid documents is for road assets approved for maintenance within this Contract. The Borough shall provide written notification to the Contractor of any changes in approved service area road mileage or road maintenance classification. If the RSA contains a maintenance agreement with another entity (i.e. DOT, City of Wasilla, etc) that divides maintenance responsibilities, the contractor will be notified and respective maintenance will follow terms and definitions of this contract for the respective agreement.
- 2.2 Services.** The Contractor shall provide services to the Borough for all road assets approved for maintenance within the RSA to their classification and shall identify, prioritize, and plan services in accordance with the terms of this Contract. Services are comprised of three general activities as follows:
- A. Routine Maintenance.** Routine maintenance is the daily monitoring of road assets and the work required to conform to the Specifications for Road Maintenance.
 - 1. Routine Maintenance includes activities and response to conditions that are both predictable and unpredictable in nature.
 - 2. Payment for routine maintenance shall be made on a per mile basis as shown on the Bid Form.
 - B. Periodic Maintenance.** Periodic maintenance is work typically performed at certain intervals to provide protection, decrease the rate of deterioration, and preserve integrity of road assets.
 - 1. Periodic Maintenance must be timely completed which requires a written Task Order from the Borough prior to commencing work. The amount of the PO cannot be exceeded without the Borough's written approval.
 - 2. Periodic Maintenance is required to conform to the Specifications for Road Maintenance and the Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities Standard Specifications for Highway Construction (2017).
 - 3. The annual quantity of Periodic Maintenance will be reallocated every contract year by the Borough to meet the needs of the RSA.
 - 4. Payment for Periodic Maintenance shall be made at the contract unit price for the quantity of authorized work completed and accepted during the billing cycle.
 - C. Public Construction.** Public Construction is work that includes rehabilitation, alteration, extension, or repair of roadways.
 - 1. Public construction requires written authorization in the form of a Task Order from the Borough prior to commencing work. The amount of the Task Order cannot be exceeded without the Borough's written approval.

2. The annual quantity of Public Construction will be allocated every contract year to meet the needs of the RSA.
3. Payment for Public Construction shall be made at the contract unit price for the quantity of authorized work completed and accepted during the billing cycle.
4. All Public construction, no matter the value of the Task Order, shall not pay less than the current prevailing wage rates as described in Alaska Statute 36.05.
5. Public Construction is required to conform to the Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities Standard Specifications for Highway Construction (2017)

2.3 Three (3)-Year Anticipated Work Plan. The Borough shall provide the Contractor a Three-Year Anticipated Work Plan in a format determined by the Borough:

- A. By no later than 90 days after a complete Startup Condition Assessment has been received from the Contractor for the first contract year.
- B. Each year thereafter on or before March 1 of each contract year (if the contract is renewed).

2.4 Additional Work. The Borough may request Contractor to perform additional work. Contractor may provide a proposal for requested Additional Work to the Borough for acceptance, including a description of the work to be completed and the price. Compensation for Additional Work will be at the agreed price.

- A. Additional Work completed without the Borough's approval will not be paid.
- B. Nothing in this Contract is intended to restrict the Borough from hiring other contractors to perform Additional Work. The Borough may use other contractors to complete work.

2.5 Equipment. The Contractor's rates for equipment are shown in contract documents. Rates will cover per hour, with operator, and shall include the total amount the Borough will pay under every circumstance covered by this contract.

2.6 Changes to Contract. Changes to the Contract must be in writing and can only made by the Borough. Contractor shall not perform work on any road, bridge or pedestrian facility not shown on the GIS dashboard or specifically identified within this contract unless otherwise provided by written change order issued by the Borough. The Borough may adjust road mileage or modify any road maintenance classification by issuing a change order to the Contractor.
